GRANT PREPARATION We agreed to appoint an ad hoc committee to provide us with information needed to prepare an emergency preparation grant application which we will submit to the city by May 31, 2024. COMMUNICATIONS WITH MEMBERS We are interested in the most efficient way to reach the most citizens with consistent messaging. We believe the primary communication tool should be the webpage supplemented with short notices whenever there is new information on the website. Examples: "there is a meeting coming up on...." or "We had a meeting; the minutes are on the webpage". The short notices (blurbs) will be sent to the monthly newsletter <u>Being Heard</u> at Mary's Woods, to Marylhurst HOA for their blast email list, to Mercy Greenbrae as they develop their own internal communication medium, and to contacts at the SNJM Provincial Office PO Box 398 Marylhurst OR 97036, and SNJM Regional Office PO Box 25 Marylhurst OR 97036. Other stakeholders like the city of Lake Oswego, Heron Creek, Harmony Academy, and Franciscan Spiritual Center can be on an association email roster which would also be used to send out the blurb.

MARYLHURST POST OFFICE Our bylaws indicate that non resident property owners who want to be contacted about neighborhood association activities can request to be on our mailing list. We also have residents and businesses in the SE sector of our area that only get their mail at this post office. Therefore, we will develop a flyer to be posted at the Post Office informing them that if they wish to get our notices, we need either their email or PO Box number preferably both. The annual notice of our general membership meeting is to be done by USPS so we really need the PO Box numbers.
