



MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

March 19, 2026, at Nathman Hall, 17530 Provost St., Lake Oswego

ATTENDING: 32 voting members plus 3 guests

At 6:35 the meeting was called to order by chair, Ricky Stowell, who welcomed our guest speakers: Sgt. Earl Hall LOPD, Amber Hambrick LOPD Behavioral Health, and Chris Durkee bond measure PAC member. Sgt. Hall and Amber then addressed the audience. Sgt. Hall is also a transit police officer working with the LOPD. Ms. Handrick works with officers both in Lake Oswego and West Linn when they need assistance with mental health situations.

Outgoing board member Sister Mary Ellen Holohan was presented with a B2WR workbook as a token of appreciation for her 2 years of service. Then, secretary, Carole White, gave a short overview of the activities in our neighborhood and the board this last year. The decision to endorse the fire station rebuild bond measure was done after outreach was made to neighbors not currently represented on the board. We also recognized Greenbrae's first full year of occupancy and the demolition of Davignon hall to make way for parking.

Chris Durkee then gave an overview of the 2-year process leading to the fire station rebuild bond measure and the arguments in favor of a yes vote in May. Cole Trusty was delayed but we had his presentation slides, and Chris Durkee was familiar with the presentation. So Chris also updated us on the city's planning for emergency water distribution should any of the water piping in the city be damaged in an earthquake.

At the time for election, nominating committee member Barbara Fisher introduced the candidates on the following ballot.

Ballot: Ricky Stowell, Chair; John Rondon, Vice Chair; Carole White, Secretary; Russell Boschetto, Director; Charles Slightham, Director; and Brent Nunn, Director.

Charlie Slightham called for nominations from the floor, but there were none. Then Jim Carleton moved that we cast a unanimous ballot. The motion was seconded by Jim Mountain. The motion carried with no dissent or abstentions.

The meeting concluded with a presentation on Emergency Communications. Jim Carleton was the presenter. This year Jim started a monthly radio net on channel 6/22 which has been assigned to our neighborhood association by the city. It is to be used for practice as well as emergency communications. In February he had 15 participants on the monthly check-in. He invited more people to contact him and get involved as part of our being prepared.
